4. Receiving President's Report by Corey Peterson

2021 – another year of significant challenges across the board for our member institutions and their staff. In 2021, our own staff went in and out of lockdowns like most of the country with various impacts on their availability, tasking, and wellbeing. But being the passionate people that they are, looking from outside ACTS was busier than ever with programs, webinars, and communications to ensure our members were supported. This commitment means that even though it is likely that 2022 and beyond will continue to reveal more COVID impacts, we know that ACTS itself rests in good hands with our amazing staff.



We also, of course, have a passionate and committed Board made up of staff (and former staff) of our member institutions in both Australia and New Zealand. I cannot thank them enough for being there to consider and act on the many issues we address every year.

The Times Higher Education Impact ranking in 2021 once again shows that the Australasian region is a world leader in sustainability outcomes and impact.

2021 Overview

- Finalised the move from an Association based in Queensland to a Company Limited by
 Guarantee and the attendant constitutional change coming into force to guide our activities,
 including that the appointment of officers (President, Vice Presidents, Treasurer) will be done by
 the Board from the group elected from member organisations and lifetime memberships.
 Notable Board happenings:
 - Appoint a new Secretary, Sally Northover from Macquarie University (thanks Sally for volunteering!) And a huge acknowledge to Delwyn Langdon for her decades of service as ACTS Secretary and continued role on the Board
 - Noting Ray O'Brien (University of Otago) has stepped up as our inaugural New Zealand Vice President.
 - Farewelled Clare Walker (University of Melbourne) with much thanks and welcomed Sue Hopkins as her Board-nominated replacement until this AGM
- New and improved organisational strategy developed by staff and the board for presentation at the 2021 AGM
- Another year without a physical conference, but rather lots of webinars, roundtable, and panel
 events to guide, inform and engage our members and interested parties; noting that the General
 Manager and President were able to fly the ACTS flag at the virtual Tertiary Education
 Management Conference (TEMC) covering who we are as an organisation, our offerings of
 Green Impact and the Green Gown Awards Australasia
- Surveyed the membership as to preference for a future conference delivery model
- Green Gown Awards Australasia are going ahead in an online ceremony on 18 November
- Green Impact program is still well-supported within the membership.
- · Acts of Connection a very successful member benefit
- ACTS Board members participated as judges in the EAUC Green Gown Awards and the International Green Gown Awards
- Partnerships
 - Continued collaboration with partners (AASHE, EAUC, SOS-UK, CANIE) that includes online events and for AASHE an updated MoU
 - Continued support for the STARS cohort approach in the Australasian region with additional universities joining the group or expressing an interest in STARS; Carmen Primo Perez (UTAS and ACTS Treasurer) represents our region on the STARS 3.0 coordinating committee



- Continued partnerships with SDSN AuNZPacific for the SDG Series Accelerating SDG Practice discussion forums and workshops online)
- Established an MoU with the Green Building Council of Australia and is a partner in their 2022 "Transform" conference
- Continue to explore opportunities with TEFMA, including Board members volunteering to work with TEFMA on updating their environmental indicators reporting
- Website improvements project underway, especially members only area, key ACTS contacts, timeline history feature, and resource hub with a webinar archive
